


We are glad that we have had this opportunity and we all would strongly recommend this experience to other students in the future.

Christmas is almost upon us but it is still important to remember that this year's Remembrance Sunday coincided with Armistice Day and the hundred year anniversary of the end of the First World War. Our Library display reminded everyone of the importance of wearing a poppy as a symbol of remembrance and hope. We also looked at how different countries observe their remembrance ceremonies.

In addition, pupils were encouraged to measure themselves against our height chart. Many boys were 5ft 3" and over and realised they would have been encouraged to join the 250,000 boys and young men under the age of 19 who enlisted to fight in 'The Great War'. It is estimated that fifty per cent of underage soldiers who fought on the front line were killed, taken prisoner, suffered from 'shell shock' or life changing injuries.



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



The race consisted of 3 timed runs through the same slalom course, the total time for the fastest 2 runs will count for an individual.


Corbet entered three teams consisting of 3 or 4 skiers. The 3 skiers with the fastest aggregate times for 2 runs were added together to calculate the team score.

Emergency Arrangements

In the event of an unscheduled school closure

Each year we publish details of a programme which school will follow in the event of a sudden emergency, e.g. severe weather, burst pipes, fire etc. This year it will be as follows and we ask you to *PLEASE KEEP THIS SECTION IN A SAFE PLACE FOR FUTURE REFERENCE*.

We shall ask **BBC Radio Shropshire (96FM) and Free Radio (103.1FM)** to transmit details between 7am and 8am, and details should appear on the BBC Radio Shropshire website <u>www.bbc.co.uk/shropshire</u>

If the school is closing we shall send a text message alert to parents via the schools messaging system.

Parents can ring the Shropshire Council's **Snowline number 0345 6789073** or refer to school closures on their website **shropshire.gov.uk/school-closures**

If there is more widespread severe weather the Shropshire Council Authority will activate a **Helpline** for parents. (When operating, the Helpline number will be given out by the Radio Stations).

Otherwise, if parents are doubtful about the school opening, they should contact their nearest Parent Contact (below). The school will inform these contacts and they have kindly agreed to relay details.

Pupils travelling by school bus should wait at the usual place for 30 minutes after the usual pick-up time. If the bus does not arrive, return home. This is normal practice for every morning in case the bus is delayed.

ALL PARENTS/CARERS ARE ASKED TO MAKE ALTERNATIVE ARRANGEMENTS FOR THEIR CHILD IN CASE OF AN EMERGENCY AT SCHOOL DURING THE WORKING DAY. E.G. SUDDEN SEVERE SNOW, OR SOME OTH-ER EMERGENCY, WHICH MAY MAKE IT NECESSARY TO SEND CHILDREN HOME EARLY.
