#### Hello again,

Thankfully we seem to have been spared the worst effects of the winter weather so let's hope this continues. We have had some winter illness but not as bad as last year's flu outbreak.

The process of appointing my successor is now in full swing. The Chair of Governors will be informing parents, carers and other stakeholders of the successful candidate soon after the half term break.

It is disappointing that the government is indicating that it will not fund any pay rise for teachers in the next academic year. If this is the case it will put a great many schools into financial difficulty which will inevitably have a detrimental effect on pupil's education. It is more important than ever that you contact our local MP's to explain the need for satisfactory education funding. After all, the Prime Minister has promised us that "austerity" is over.

I hope you were able to see the recent government school performance table which showed that pupils from The Corbet School are performing exceptionally well compared to those from other schools locally and further afield. It was particularly pleasing that whatever the ability of a student that they made very good progress during their time at the Corbet. We are never complacent as a school and it's our very clear aim to ensure all of our pupils reach their full potential.

The year 9 pupils have enjoyed another successful skiing trip to the Aosta Valley in I taly. As always, it was a fun and action packed trip with many pupils experiencing the joys of skiing for the first time and others perfecting their skills on the slopes.

Our year 10 pupils taking separate sciences had a very enjoyable trip to 'Science Live' in Birmingham. Also, Year 10 GCSE pupils had an interesting visit to Derby Velodrome and our hardworking year 11 Prefects enjoyed a trip to AMF Bowling by way of a 'thank you' for their support.

As usual our sporting teams have been in action; full details inside.

We had a very successful KS1 Maths morning with pupils from local primary schools and the support of our maths young leaders. The Year 5 primary pupils will be coming to the Corbet on the last day of this half term to be given lessons by our year 10, language young leaders.

#### School Library :



#### **Emergency Arrangements**

#### In the event of an unscheduled school closure

Each year we publish details of a programme which school will follow in the event of a sudden emergency, e.g. severe weather, burst pipes, fire etc. This year it will be as follows and we ask you to *PLEASE KEEP THIS SECTION IN A SAFE PLACE FOR FUTURE REFERENCE*.

We shall ask **BBC Radio Shropshire (96FM) and Free Radio (103.1FM)** to transmit details between 7am and 8am, and details should appear on the BBC Radio Shropshire website <u>www.bbc.co.uk/shropshire</u>

If the school is closing we shall send a text message alert to parents via the schools messaging system.

Parents can ring the Shropshire Council's **Snowline number 0345 6789073** or refer to school closures on their website **shropshire.gov.uk/school-closures** 

If there is more widespread severe weather the Shropshire Council Authority will activate a **Helpline** for parents. (When operating, the Helpline number will be given out by the Radio Stations).

Otherwise, if parents are doubtful about the school opening, they should contact their nearest Parent Contact (below). The school will inform these contacts and they have kindly agreed to relay details.

Pupils travelling by school bus should wait at the usual place for 30 minutes after the usual pick-up time. If the bus does not arrive, return home. This is normal practice for every morning in case the bus is delayed.

ALL PARENTS/CARERS ARE ASKED TO MAKE ALTERNATIVE ARRANGEMENTS FOR THEIR CHILD IN CASE OF AN EMERGENCY AT SCHOOL DURING THE WORKING DAY. E.G. SUDDEN SEVERE SNOW, OR SOME OTH-ER EMERGENCY, WHICH MAY MAKE IT NECESSARY TO SEND CHILDREN HOME EARLY.
