



Strategic Summary

The Catch-Up premium is given to the school to support Year 7 students with below the expected standard attainment at the end of Key Stage 2 in English and/or mathematics. We use the funding directly to accelerate progress in literacy and numeracy and close the attainment gap between them and their peers.

The students in receipt of 'Catch-up Premium' benefitted from a range of interventions to support them in closing gaps in their reading, spelling and/or mathematics and are making some exceptional levels of progress. (*AS At Standard is the expected standard with a score of 100 in the KS2 SATS*).

- 36 students (26%) had a reading age of less than 11 years at the beginning of the year. When the pupils were re-tested at the end of the year, this number had reduced to 13 (9%).
- 90 students (62%) in the year group made more than 12 months of progress in their reading.
- 52 students (35%) made exceptional levels of progress in their reading (2 years or more in 12 months).
- 38 students (27%) had a spelling age of less than 11 years, with 21 students (14%) having a spelling age of less than 9 years.
- When the pupils were re-tested on their spelling at the end of the year, 22 students (16%) had a spelling age of less than 11 years.
- 55 students (38%) made exceptional progress in their spelling (2 years or more in 12 months)

In mathematics, for the students who were not AS:

78% of those pupils are on track for at least a standard pass (Grade 4)

In English, for the students who were not AS:

74% of those pupils are on track for at least a standard pass (Grade 4)
