They are still very much in our thoughts and have been throughout as we have been going through the process to submit Centre Assessed Grades and think about the arrangements for results day in August. As soon as I know what we can do on that day we will let you know. I am also highly aware that we have not been able to say farewell properly and are discussing how we can do this in the Autumn Term. I will be thinking of them all tomorrow evening when we would all have been enjoying a celebration of five years hard work and time together at The Corbet School. Could they please keep an eye out for any emails from Mrs Smith with careers information and look at their college websites to ensure that they do not miss any virtual induction days that are currently ongoing.

Year 10: We have decided to arrange the Year 10 on-site provision next week so that pupils can have some face-to-face time with teachers of their options subjects and their language subject. Please look out for the separate email sent to relevant parents/guardians soon.

Teaching & Learning: We were hoping that the government would allow us the opportunity to have some face-to-face on-site contact with other year groups in addition to the Year 10s before the summer holidays. Under the current guidelines, this now looks very unlikely. Therefore, we have decided to put some Tutor Group 'Zoom' sessions in place for Years 7, 8 and 9 pupils next week. We hope that this will go some way to providing a face-to-face experience for the pupils in these year groups. Furthermore, this first attempt by the teachers at running class Zoom sessions will provide us with an opportunity to gauge

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whether we are able to expand this way of working, particularly during the autumn term should the need arise due to further enforced school closures. The guide will also be sent to the pupils via Satchel so that they understand how to use the system and the essential etiquette to be followed.

The SEND Local Offer has also developed a <u>new COVID-19 section</u>, which includes information on resources and support, frequently asked question, and educating children at home.
