- A protractor










What happens on my first day?

When you arrive, staff and pupils will be at the bus turn or reception to direct you to where you need to go. These will include the Year 7 form tutors, your Head of Year, Mrs Selman and Assistant Head KS3, Mrs Simms.

Your parents cannot come on the school grounds with you.

Then you will go to the Year 7 area on the tennis courts where your form tutor will take you to your your form rooms, just like on the transition days.

Extra-curricular opportunities


Clubs will help you develop skills such as, leadership, teamwork and communication.

Our clubs cover a number of interests, including art, choirs, bands, orchestras, science, films, board games, debates and much more.


Afterschool and lunch sports activities are also on offer. These include football, netball, rugby, badminton, table tennis, athletics, rounders and cricket.

Frequently Asked Questions

What happens at break and lunchtime?

At break and lunchtimes all pupils are expected to be outside. At breaktimes Year 7 are the only year group who are allowed to use the tennis courts. At Lunchtimes Year 7 are allowed on the courts to play football on a Thursday. Pupils are allowed in to purchase food on a rota basis. Year 7 are first in on a Thursday.



What do I do if people are being unkind to me?

Thankfully, unkindness at The Corbet School is rare. However, it is really important that it is reported to your form tutor if you experience this. The quicker this is dealt with the less likely this will turn into bullying.

Can I bring in a mobile phone?

Mobile phones are not permitted at The Corbet School. They need to be switched off and in your bag. Students are responsible for keeping their phones safe.

Will I need my PE kit on the first day?

Pupils receive their timetables on the first day. We do not expect pupils to have their PE on the first day. The PE department will go through their expectations if you have PE on the first day. PE kit will be needed after this on your timetabled days.



What do I do if I don't know where to go?

There will be plenty of people who will help you. Speak to older pupils or members of staff. Don't be afraid to ask for help. You can also use the map in the booklet.

What do I do if I am feeling unwell?

If you are feeling unwell at school. It is really important that you let a member of staff know. They may send you to reception, where they will look after you and if needed, parents will be called to collect you.
